RANGE REGULATIONS FOR SHORT SIBERIA GALLERY RANGE

THE RANGE	
Name	Short Siberia Gallery Range
Description	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Short Siberia Range is a 100 - 200yd Gallery range consisting of 27 target lanes, with 27 lanes available at 100m and 9 available at 200yds 2. 27 x lanes at 100m are available on Saturdays 3. 18 x lanes at 100m and 9 at 200yds are available on Sundays. 4. McQueens Castles can be fitted on Lanes 24 and 26
FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION	
Firearms and ammunition that may be fired on the range including ME & MV	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Rifles, gallery rifles, shotguns and pistols by special arrangement only: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. A maximum muzzle velocity of 1000 m/s (3280 ft/s) b. A maximum muzzle energy of 4500 J (3319 ft lb) c. Firearms 4500J – 7000J HME procedures apply
RANGE SAFETY LIMITATIONS	
Coordinating Instructions	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Vehicles are not permitted on the Range Floor . 2. The Butts are to be accessed by the Markers walkway passage over the mantlet is not permitted. 3. All shooting must cease to allow access in to and out of Stickle-down Range. 4. Fire with movement is not permitted on Short Siberia range 5. All firers must access the 200yd firing point from the car park passage across the range floor is not permitted. 6. Shooting from 100yds is not permitted. 7. When shooting target shotgun at the right hand turning targets the relevant butt target frames are to be removed from the cantilever frames. 8. Muzzle brakes are not permitted on the covered firing points.
Firing Positions	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. All shooting is to be conducted from the left of pegs. 2. Shooting is to be carried out from the prone or supine position, or from a bench except where expressly provided by the conditions of a particular discipline or approved competition rules. The intention to fire from any other position, or use a muzzle brake, must be notified to the Range Office at the time of booking to allow suitable target allocation on the range.

Targetry	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Unless prior permission has been obtained from the CE only targets from the NRA approved set may be used. 2. Targets are to be used in the frames or holders provided and are to be engaged only from the recognised firing points. 3. Snap targets are to be exposed in, or in front of, target frames. 4. No laterally-moving target may be used on gallery ranges. 5. Skittles, falling plates or other hard targets may not be engaged at a distance of less than 25yds (22 metres) without the permission of the CE.
